
SOI: Tahiti and Darwin as "centers of action", mslp correlations between two locations



Tahiti and Darwin are at opposite ends of the Southern Oscillation's seesaw, and so the difference in pressure between them is used to measure the Southern Oscillation. The numbers represent a statistical measure called the correlation coefficient. The figure shows that the pressure variation at Tahiti is as closely related to Darwin as are locations near to Darwin, but with the opposite sign (i.e., if the Pressure is high at Darwin, it is low at Tahiti and vice versa).
